HOW YOU LIKE THEM, NOW?:

Every sports fan in America and beyond knows by now that former Jackson State head coach Deion "Coach Prime" Sanders and former JSU players, QB Shedeur Sanders and DB/WR Travis Hunter, were outstanding in their new team, Colorado's, monumental 45-42 upset of No. 17 TCU last Saturday.

All summer long speculation had centered on how the two Sanders (father Deion and son Shedeur) and Hunter, who Deion also refers to as his son, would fare after moving up from the black college, **SWAC** and FCS level at Jackson State to the FBS at Pac-12 member, Colorado.

Well, the answer is clear, now.

Shedeur completed 38 of 47 passes for a schoolrecord 510 yards and four TDs. Hunter had 11 receptions, many showing off his breath-taking athletic ability, for 119 yards on offense and a spectacular interception and three tackles on defense. Hunter also was in position for two touchdowns receptions and another pick. He was one of four Buffs to have over 100 receiving yards.

Coach Sanders has 68 new players on his re-made Buffalos roster.

Shedeur Sanders passed for 6,963 yards, 70 TDs and 14 interceptions in two years at JSU. There was still some doubt as to his ability to succeed on the FBS level. That doubt has certainly been put to rest for now after his performance.

No one knew just how effective Hunter, playing on both sides of the ball, would fare. He logged 129 snaps in the game and was a difference-maker on both defense and offense.

There's little doubt now that Sanders and Hunter are early candidates for the Heisman Trophy.

All eyes will again be on the trio as they have their home opener this week vs. Nebraska.

Bitter rivalries top the menu in week 2

Two traditional bitter rivalry games top the list of another list of 36 games in week two of the 2023 black college football season this week.

North Carolina A&T hosts North Carolina Central Saturday (7 p.m. on FloFootball) in the 101st renewal of their fierce Interstate-40, former CIAA and MEAC rivalry while Southern hosts Jackson State in Baton Rouge (6 p.m. on ESPN+) in the 68th meeting between SWAC rivals. The JSU/SU game is dubbed the Pete Richardson Classic after the former Southern coach who compiled a 169-76-1 record and led the Jaguars to five SWAC and black college national championships from 1993 to 2009.

The Aggie/Eagle rivalry

After four straight losses in their series, Trei Oliver's Eagles of NC Central knocked off A&T 28-13 last season in Charlotte en route to its **MEAC** and *Celebration Bowl* championships. The latter win gave the Eagles the 2022 HBCU national championship.

NC A&T is 14-9 vs. NCCU since 1998.

NCCU (1-0) comes in after a 47-21 whipping of former CIAA rival Winston-Salem **State** last week to open the season. A&T fell on the road to UAB, 35-6 Thursday in its opener under new head coach Vincent Brown.

"Everyone has spoken about this game since I got here, the importance of it," Brown said Monday at A&T's press conference. "I understand, it's a very, very important game for the Aggie faithful. We will be ready. We will do everything in our power to make sure the kids are prepared for this game with the mindset of going out and beating last year's HBCU national champs, North Carolina Central.

"They have talented players. They probably

have one of the best quarterbacks at the FCS level in **Davius Richard**. The running back, (Latrell) Collier, is a punishing downhill runner that breaks lots of tackles. The offensive line has size. The defense runs to the ball. But as we said last week, this is about us, not them. We're going to make sure our kids are ready."

Jaguars vs. Tigers in Baton Rouge

Southern leads the series with Jackson State that dates back to 1929, 35-32. JSU posted two wins over Southern in 2022. The Tigers pitched a 35-0 shutout vs. the Jags on Oct. 29 and then defeated them 43-24 in the SWAC Championship Game on Dec. 3.

Both Southern and Jackson State are coming off losses. Southern (0-1) was downed by Alabama State 14-10 Saturday in its opener. After opening with a 37-7 rout of South Carolina State in new head coach T. C. Taylor's debut to open the season, JSU (1-1, 0-1 SWAC E) fell to Florida A&M in a key SWAC E. Division matchup Sunday, 28-10.

In other games to watch, **Hampton** (1-0) hosts **Norfolk State** (0-1) in the *Battle of the* Bay (6 p.m., FloFootball), (0-1) Arkansas-**Pine Bluff** and (0-1) **Tennessee State** do battle in Memphis at the Southern Heritage Classic (6 p.m., HBCUGo), Morgan State (1-0), coming off a big win over nationally-ranked Richmond, is at FBS Akron (6 p.m., ESPN+) and Grambling tackles LSU in Baton Rouge (6:30 p.m., *ESPN*+).

Several recent moves settled the number of HBCU players on NFL opening-day 2023 rosters at 31, the same as a year ago.

On Monday, New Orleans terminated the practice squad contract of Arkansas-Pine Bluff undrafted rookie free agent offensive lineman Mark Evans II. Also on Monday, fourth-year veteran defensive back Bobby Price out of Norfolk State was added to the Arizona practice squad.

The 31 players includes the lone 2023 draftee from the

HBCU ranks, Jackson State defensive back Isaiah Bolden who was placed on injured reserve by New England. It is presumed that Bolden will be released by the Patriots once he clears the concussion protocol and will be eligible to sign with another team. Twenty-two of the HBCU

players will begin on 53-man

champion Kansas City and Detroit. The most senior HBCU player in the league – Arkansas-Pine Bluff 11-year veteran offensive left tackle **Terron Armstead** – is expected to start when his Miami Dolphins open Sunday at the Los Angeles Chargers. Armstead suffered a leg injury during the preseason but is projected to be ready.

South Carolina State will once again have the most players on NFL rosters. Six Bulldogs, led by eight-year veterans Javon Hargrave and Antonio Hamilton, grace teams' line-ups. Hargrave signed a lucrative four-year \$84 million free agent deal with San Francisco after spending the last three seasons in Philadelphia. The SC State newcomer is rookie free agent wide receiver **Shaquan** Davis who was signed to the New Orleans practice squad.

Other undrafted rookie free agents on practice squads are former Florida A&M wide receiver Xavier Smith with the Los Angeles Rams, former Lane defensive end Andrew Farmer with the Los Angeles Chargers and former Alabama State defensive back Keenan Isaac with Tampa Bay.

Three undrafted black college rookie free agents made opening day 53-man rosters - North Carolina A&T offensive lineman Ricky Lee for Carolina and Fort Valley State running back Emmanuel Wilson for Green Bay. Former Florida A&M pass rushing specialist Isaiah Land was added to the Indianapolis roster after being released by Dallas giving the Colts three HBCU products on its squad with Shaquille Leonard and Grover Stewart.
