## JAMES HOUSTON BREAKS ANKLE:

Detroit Lions outside linebacker James Houston, a



second-year player out of Jackson State, suffered a fractured ankle in Sunday's 37-

31 loss to the Seattle Seahawks.

Houston will be out at least six to eight weeks, NFL Network Insiders Ian Rapoport and Tom Pelissero reported, per

Houston

Houston will have more testing to determine if he'll need surgery and how much longer he would be out. Lions' Head Coach Dan Campbell confirmed Houston will be out for awhile.

The 6-1, 245-pound Houston started Sunday's game vs. Seatlle and posted one solo tackle before suffering the injury. He played sparingly in the Lions' 21-20 seasonopening win over the Super Bowl champion Kansas City

Chiefs, posting just one hit on the quarterback. Houston, a sixth-round pick by Detroit in the 2022 NFL Draft, was waived on August 30, 2022 and signed to the practice squad the next day. He was promoted to the active roster on November 28. During a Thanksgiving Day matchup against the Buffalo Bills and QB Josh Allen, Houston recorded two sacks, two solo tackles, and a fumble recovery in just five defensive snaps. He followed this up with a sack in each of his next three games, becoming only the third player in NFL history (along with Terrell Suggs and Santana Dotson) to open his career with a four-game sack streak.

He went on to finish with eight sacks in seven games contributing to the Lions winning five of those games to close out the season.

In his only season at JSU (2021) playing for head coach Deion "Coach Prime" Sanders after transferring from Florida, Houston finished with 70 tackles (52 solo), 24.5 tackles for loss (2nd SWAC/t-2nd FCS), 16.5 sacks (2nd SWAC/t-2nd FCS), seven forced fumbles (1st in SWAC & FCS), two fumble recoveries, one interception, eight QB hurries, and two defensive touchdowns.

# **ROBERTS WINS ACC & NATIONAL AWARD:**

Former N. C. A&T linebacker Jacob Roberts, who transferred to Wake Forest after the 2022 season, won a conference and national award this week.

Roberts recorded a game-high 13 tackles (four solo), including 4.0 for losses, three quarterback sacks and forced one fumble as Wake Forest came-from-behind to defeat Old Dominion, 27-24. His efforts earned him ACC Linebacker of the Week and Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week.

Through three games, the 6-1, 233-pound senior leads the Demon Deacons with 31 tackles and five sacks for -40 yards. Roberts was second on the Aggies with 72 tackles a year ago but did not have a sack.

# **Unbeatens few and far between thru Week 3**

Three weeks into the 2023 football season and there are only five teams left with unblemished records in black college football.

Two are in the CIAA - Virginia Union and Virginia State - and three are in the SIAC -Benedict, Tuskegee and Allen.

VUU and VSU are no surprises as they are legitimate and perennial contenders for CIAA honors. The same goes for defending SIAC champion Benedict and Tuskegee, who won their respective divisions a season ago and met in the league's 2022 championship game.

But Allen is a different story.

The Yellow Jackets are in their fifth year returning to football in 2018 after a 15-year hiatus. They have been led since their return by head coach **Teddy Keaton** and are seeking their first winning season.

In 2022, the Jackets finished 2-8 overall, 0-7 in SIAC play – not very good to say the least. But of those seven conference losses, four were by single digits. Three were by less than four points - a one-point loss to Clark Atlanta (42-41), a two-point loss to Fort Valley State (29-27) and a three-point loss to Central State (35-32). They fell to Tuskegee by eight (35-27). Their other losses were to **Kentucky State** (41-22), Benedict (54-21) and **Edward Waters** (38-12).

They avenged one of those losses with a 34-30 win over Kentucky State Saturday. Sophomore quarterback David Wright threw (30-53-2) for 411 yards and five touchdown passes, four in the fourth quarter as Allen erased a 23-point deficit, scoring 27 unanswered points to pull out the win. Wright currently leads the SIAC passing stats at 390.5 yards per game with 7 TDs.

The Jackets continue their redemption tour Saturday (1 p.m.) at Central State (0-1, 1-2 SIAC).

Elsewhere in the SIAC Saturday at 1 p.m.. Benedict travels to 2022 CIAA finalist and new South Atlantic Conference (SAC) member Chowan (0-3), Tuskegee (3-0, 2-0) under new head coach Aaron James, hosts 0-3 Lane, and

Fort Valley State (2-1, 2-0) is at Kentucky State (1-2, 0-2). Edward Waters (0-3, 0-2) hosts Morehouse (0-3, 0-1) at 2 p.m., Albany State (1-2, 1-0) and Savannah State (2-1, 1-0) meet in Brunswick, Ga. at the Coastal City HBCU Classic at 3 p.m. and Miles (2-1, 1-0) hosts winless Clark Atlanta (0-3, 0-2) at 4 p.m.

The CIAA features North vs. South division battles Saturday. In 1 p.m. starts, Bowie State (2-1, 1-0) is home vs. winless St. Augustine's (0-3, 0-1) and Elizabeth City State (1-2, 0-1) entertains Shaw (0-3, 0-1). S. Div. co-leader Winston-Salem State (1-2, 1-0) has Bluefield State (1-2, 0-1) in a 2 p.m. start while Lincoln (Pa.) (1-2) hosts S. Div. co-leader J. C. Smith (2-1, 1-0) at 7 p.m.

At 6 p.m., Virginia State hosts winless (0-3) Livingstone while Virginia Union hosts defending champion Fayetteville State (1-2, 0-1) in the Willard Bailey Classic on HBCUGo.

Unsurprisingly, there are no black college FCS teams in the MEAC, SWAC, CAA or Big South/OVC with clean records as teams in those conferences fell hard in a series of "money games" against FBS competition.

The best of those like 2-1 N. C. Central (UCLA, 59-7), 2-1 Florida A&M (South Florida, 38-24) and 2-1 **Tennessee State** (Notre Dame, 56-3) have taken it on the chin in such
