

Willie Slater was dismissed from his duties "effective immediately," the university announced Monday.

The decision came following an evaluation of CAU's 0-5 football team during the 2023 season. The university said there were some unresolved

challenges and explored manv opportunities for change but they had minimal success, the university said in a statement.

With his 3-7 finish in the 2022 season, Slater was 3-12 since taking the CAU job last season. Prior to CAU, he spent 16 years at Tuskegee where his teams were 123-47 winning seven Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference titles.

In the coming days, the CAU Administration said it will discuss the strategy for the remainder of its football season with its athletics department and the university's Athletic Director, Jerel Drew.

Ranked teams in critical

The first month of the 2023 black college football season has ended with just two teams left with undefeated overall records - Virginia State of the CIAA and Benedict of the SIAC, both at 5-0.

Benedict, the defending SIAC champion under head coach Chennis Berry, tops the BCSP HBCU Div. II Top Five and is nationally ranked. The Tigers are 13th in the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) NCAA Div. II poll and 12th in the d2football.com Top 25.

Virginia State, in its second-year under veteran head coach Henry Frazier III, is second in the BCSP Div. II/NAIA poll but not nationally ranked in either poll.

Pollsters apparently haven't taken notice of VSU's season-opening 33-24 win over MEAC and Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) member Norfolk State or its 21-17 win over Div. II South Atlantic Conference (SAC) Mountain Division leader Tusculum. Norfolk State has since gone 2-1 vs. members of the powerful FCS Coastal Athletic Association (CAA) with wins over Hampton (31-23) and Towson (21-14) before falling to North Carolina A&T Saturday (28-26).

In the AFCA poll, VSU received 47 votes to finish behind Augustana (SD, 51 votes) just outside the Top 25.

Virginia Union (4-1), with its only loss a 10-7 last-second decision to defending CIAA champion Fayetteville State, is the other nationally ranked HBCU Div. II team. The Panthers, under head coach Dr. Alvin Parker, are 23rd in the d2football. com Top 25. They are not in the AFCA Div. II poll.

North Carolina Central and Florida A&M, both 4-1, appear in the latest FCS national rankings

NCCU tops the BCSP FCS Top Five and is coming off a thrilling 49-48 win in overtime vs. CAA member Campbell Saturday. The defending MEAC champion Eagles, under head coach Trei than to return the favor. Oliver, are up from 13th to 11th in the AFCA FCS poll and are 14th in the STATS Perform FCS Top 25.

Simmons, checks in at 19th in the STATS poll and 16th in the AFCA poll. FAMU currently leads the SWAC East with a 3-0 record.

THIS WEEK'S MATCH UPS

All four of the ranked teams and Virginia State are on the road for tough match ups.

Benedict plays at 4-1 Miles Saturday (4 p.m.) in a critical SIAC tilt that will be carried live by HBCUGo on The Grio. Both Benedict and Miles are 3-0 in SIAC play.

Miles, led by second-year head coach Sam Shade, is playing much better this season after finishing 1-9 in 2022. The Golden Beans have beaten SWAC member Alabama State (21-17) and their only loss is a one-point decision (21-20) to SWAC member Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

Virginia Union plays at Elizabeth City State Saturday (1 p.m. CIAA Network). ECSU is 1-4 overall but winless (0-3) in CIAA play. The dangerous Vikings, under second-year head coach Marcus Hilliard, have three losses by single digits including a heartbreaking 21-20 loss to J. C. Smith Saturday at homecoming.

Virginia State travels to Bowie State's homecoming Saturday (2 p.m., CIAA Network). BSU has to be smarting after losing at then winless Livingstone Saturday, 31-18. A year ago, BSU adminstered a 41-14 whipping to VSU and former BSU head coach Frazier at its homecoming. Frazier and the Trojans would like nothing better

age of 89 per a release by the university on their social media accounts. Smith is arguably the greatest coach in Albany State football history, leading the program from 1971-1976 and 1982-1999.

Smith

In his second stint as Albany State's head coach beginning in 1982,

he led the Golden Rams to the most successful years in program history. In those 17 years, the Rams won nine SIAC championships including a three-peat from 1984-1986 and a five-peat from 1993-1997. From 1993-1997 his teams made the NCAA Division II Playoffs five times and advanced to the quarterfinals in 1997.

Before his coaching career, Smith played football (1953-56) and graduated from at what is now Mississippi Valley State University. He earned his master's degree from Tennessee State University and started his coaching career as an assistant at MVSU in 1959. He joined Albany State for his first stint as head coach in 1971. The Rams went 27-28-3 with successive winning seasons in 1972 (7-2-1, 4-1-1 SIAC) and 1973 (6-3-1, 3-2 SIAC) before his first departure in 1976.

He became an assistant coach for the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff from 1977-1978 and then joined MVSU's coaching staff in 1979 before rejoining the Rams as an assistant coach from 1980-1981.
