

LANE'S JACOBY JONES PASSES:



in for former Lane, SIAC and NFL standout receiver and kick returner **Jacoby Jones** who died overnight in his sleep Sunday.

After a slow start to his NFL career, Jones emerged as a record-setting Super Bowl performer for the Baltimore Ravens.

In a statement released Sunday through the NFL Players Association, Jones' family said that he died "peacefully" at his home in New Orleans.

"The family, including his mother, Emily and his son, Little Jacoby, are together and are asking for prayers, privacy, and support as they navigate through this difficult

Jones, 40, was a four-time all-SIAC player and the conference's offensive player of the year and most valuable player his during his senior season in 2006.

In that season, he led the SIAC in receiving yards per game (74.7), receptions per game (6.18), receiving touchdowns (6), all-purpose yards (189.9 ypg.) and punt return average (13.8). He returned two kickoffs and a punt for touchdowns, and finished second in the conference in scoring with 10 TDs. He also had 68 receptions for 822 yards, helping the Dragons finish with an 8-3 record.

Those numbers and performances led to Jones being selected in the third round of the NFL Draft by Houston in 2007.

The 6-3, 190-pounder former high school track star spent five years in Houston and worked his way into significant playing time by his third season. He posted his best years between 2009 and 2011 when he racked up 119 catches for 1,511 yards and 11 TDs. He also returned two punts and one kickoff for touchdowns as the Texans' primary kick returner.

He signed with Baltimore in 2012 and spent three years with the Ravens. He had two kickoff returns, each of over 105 yards – an NFL record – in the 2012 regular season. He was named to his first Pro Bowl as a kick returner for the AFC in 2012.

In an AFC Divisional Playoff game against the Denver Broncos in early 2013, Jones scored on a 70-yard touchdown pass from Joe Flacco with 31 seconds left. The play, dubbed the "Mile High Miracle", tied the game at 35 and preceded a 38–35 double overtime win for the Ravens.

In Super Bowl XLVII against the San Francisco 49ers, Jones became the first player to score a receiving touchdown and return touchdown in the same game in Super Bowl history scoring on a 56-yard pass from Flacco and then returning the opening kickoff of the second half for a 108-yard touchdown for the longest play in Super Bowl or postseason history. The Ravens won the game by a score of 34–31, earning Jones his first Super Bowl ring and what should have been the Super Bowl MVP trophy. Jones was then the feature player on the cover of the Super Bowl XLVII edition of Sports Illustrated.

He had short NFL stints in 2015 with San Diego and Pittsburgh before retiring as a Raven in 2017. He coached receivers at Lane for two seasons and also coached receivers at Morgan State and Alabama State. Jones also served as head coach of the Beaumont Renegades indoor

Always known for his flamboyant touchdown dances and celebrations and likeable and jovial charm, Jones was a guest star on Dancing with the Stars in 2013 where he teamed with Karina Smirnoff to reach the finals.

Tributes came in from Ravens' teammates Ray Lewis and Torrey Smith and coach John Harbaugh along with Steelers' head coach Mike Tomlin.

HIWAY TO BE NAMED FOR WILLIAMS:

Longtime Saint Augustine's and Olympic track and field coach George "Pup" Williams is set to be immortalized in Raleigh, North Carolina, where he carved out a legacy for over four decades.

The North Carolina Board of Transportation approved a request that Interstate 440 in Raleigh be known as the Coach George Williams Interchange, according to the Raleigh News & Observer.

"He traveled that road about every day for probably 45 or 50 years," said North Carolina State Senator Dan Blue, a N. C. Central graduate. "So many people will be reminded of all of the tremendous contributions he has made, the leadership he has provided, as they come off of

the beltline onto New Bern Avenue." Williams helped lead his alma mater to 39 NCAA Division II indoor and outdoor national titles, coaching 282 individual national champions, winning the Division II National Coach of the Year award 20 times, and coaching 40 future Olympians.

SWAC preseason football picks unveiled

2024 SWAC FOOTBALL PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

BIRMINGHAM, Ala.- The Southwestern Athletic Conference announced its 2024 Predicted Order of Finish and Preseason All-SWAC Football selections on Tuesday during SWAC Football Media Day at the Sheraton Hotel in Downtown Birmingham.

The Predicted Order of Finish, Individual Awardees and Preseason All-SWAC teams were voted on by the league's head coaches and sports

information directors. Alabama State, led by third-year head



coach Eddie Robinson Jr., finished in a tie for second in 2023 in the East Division (7-4 overall, 5-4 E). The Hornets amassed 114 points in the voting and were picked to take the East title.

Robinson Jr. Alcorn State, who finished in a tie atop the West Division with **Prai**rie View A&M at 6-2 and finished 7-5 overall, garnered 112 points and was picked to win the West. Alcorn's new head coach is Cedric Thomas who moved over from Arkansas-Pine Bluff to replace Alcorn playing and coaching legend Fred McNair leading the Braves.

Florida A&M (104), Jackson State (87), Alabama A&M (76), Bethune-Cookman (47) and Mississippi Valley State (31) round out the East Division Preseason Poll rankings.

Prairie View A&M (104), Grambling State (72), Southern (70), Arkansas-Pine Bluff (61), and Texas Southern (40) round out the West Division Preseason Poll rankings.



Among them is defending SWAC and Celebration Bowl champion Florida A&M's new head man James Colzie III who is replacing Willie Simmons.

Also, Mickey Joseph is at Grambling **State** replacing **Hue Jackson**, **Terrence Graves** is at Southern replacing Eric Dooley, Alonzo Hampton is at Arkansas-Pine Bluff replacing Thomas and Chris Dishman is at Texas Southern replacing Clarence McKinney.

Grambling State quarterback Myles Crawley was voted Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while **Southern** defensive lineman **Ckelby** Givens was tabbed Preseason Defensive Player

Crawley solidified himself as one of the top triggermen in the SWAC throwing for 2,303 yards and 16 touchdowns last season. He was the first Grambling State quarterback to throw for at least 2,000 yards since **Devante** Kincaid in 2017.

With Crawley at starter, GSU's passing offense improved from 11th in the SWAC in 2022 to 5th in 2023. GSU's offensive production also increased under Crawley, with the Tigers' offense moving from 10th to 2nd in the

Givens led the Jaguars in sacks and tackles for loss during the 2023 season. He led the SWAC in tackles for loss (21) and finished tied for fourth in sacks (7).

He was a dominant force off the edge for the Jaguars finishing the season with 61 tackles, 21 tackles for losses of 83 yards, seven sacks for 23 yards in losses, eight quarterback hurries, one fumble recovery and four forced fumbles
