2024-25 CIAA BASKETBALL TIPOFF:

CHARLOTTE, NC (Sept. 18, 2024) - The Central



Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA)will tip off its 2024-25

basketball season with its annual Basketball Media Day on Monday, October 7th at the Under Armour Campus in Baltimore, Maryland.

All the CIAA men's and women's head basketball coaches and select players will be in Baltimore which is also the site of the 2025 CIAA Men's and Women's Basketball Championship Tournament.

The upcoming tournament marks a huge milestone for the women's basketball tournament, as it will be the 50th tournament played with the first one dating back to 1975.

Each of the CIAA's 26 head basketball coaches and select players from each program will be interviewed by Stan Lewter and Thai Floyd, who will serve as co-hosts, as the coaches and student-athletes discuss their outlook on their respective programs and expectations for the upcoming season.

In addition to being in-person, the event will be streamed live on the CIAA Sports Network beginning at 10:00 a.m. with an opening from Floyd & Lewter and the release of the CIAA preseason basketball all-conference team along with the predicted order of finish for the 2024-25 season. That will be followed up by a 15-minute focus on each school and media availability starting at 10:30

The preseason Media Day events will feature back-to-back live shows on

ESPN+ that highlight conference head coaches and two student-athletes from each team.

The MEAC Women's Basketball Media Day presented by Coca-Cola will begin with a live ESPN+ show at 10:00 a.m. ET with the announcement of the 2024-25 women's preseason predictions and All-MEAC teams, including the Preseason Player of the Year.

The MEAC Men's Basketball Media Day presented by Coca-Cola will begin after the women's show at 12:00 noon, and will also highlight preseason conference accolades. The 2025 MEAC Men's and Women's Basketball Tournament is slated for March 12-15, at Norfolk Scope Arena in Virginia.

Salvos continue into October

BCSP Editor As the 2024 football season heads into October, there are plenty of headlines.

Some new blood is making the CIAA race very interesting. The same can be said for the SIAC. The SWAC is a week away from allout war though the skirmishes begin with three key games this weekend. There was an opening salvo in the **MEAC** but that league is still weeks away from getting down to its business.

In the CIAA

Undefeated Johnson C. Smith (5-0, 2-0) and once-beaten Winston-Salem State (4-1, 2-0) are the interlopers currently atop the CIAA race. WSSU was last a conference champion in 2016. For JCSU, undefeated at 5-0 for the first time since 1969, it's been 55 years – back to 1969 – since the Golden Bulls took the title.

Two weeks ago, both pulled off stunners as JCSU knocked off 2023 champion Virginia Union (21-16) in Charlotte and WSSU went into 2024 preseason favorite Virginia State and got a last-second 15-14 win. Problem is, neither of the wins, or losses, counted on the conference's quirky seven-game league ledger.

Every CIAA game, beginning this week, will count as conference games in the league's new non-divisional race. That includes another showdown of the conference leaders.

WSSU, coming off a 28-14 takedown of Bowie State, travels to Richmond Saturday (1 p.m.) to take on VUU (2-2, 1-0), after its 42-7 shellacking of Shaw Saturday.

JCSU, after whipping Bluefield State 42-3, is hosting VSU (2-2, 1-0) in Charlotte, NC (2 p.m., CIAASN) after the Trojans' convincing 35-18 win over **Fayetteville State**.

In the SIAC

Undefeated Clark Atlanta (4-0-1, 3-0 SIAC) is still the talk of the SIAC. The last time the Panthers' name appears in SIAC championship history is in a five-way tie with four others for the crown in 1991.
